How to Cite a Website in MLA

Structure:

Note: Only include the information you have. If there is no publisher, use: **N.p.** If there is no date of publication use **n.d.**

Last name, First name. "Article Title." *Website Title*. Publisher of Website, Day Month Year article was published. **Web.** Day Month Year article was accessed. <URL>.

Example:

"EasyBib: The Free Automatic Bibliography Composer." *EasyBib*. N.p., n.d. Web. 06 Oct. 2015.
